



Discover the Lifelong Benefits of a Classical Christian Education


Western classical education is a centuries-old tradition of training students to engage with the world critically. Instead of lecture-based teaching resulting in short-term memorization to pass an exam, a classical approach emphasizes discussion and reasoning for the purpose of owning material in a larger context. **The goal is to teach students** *how* **to think, not just** *what* **to think.**

When a classical education is paired with a biblical worldview, students have a framework to view the world holistically. Subjects aren't siloed; history, science, math, and language are interconnected and point back to divine creation and design. At its core, a classical Christian education is a pursuit of all that is true, good and beautiful with the recognition that truth, goodness and beauty are absolutes rooted in the triune God of Scripture. Additionally, classical Christian educators value discipleship and building relationships with their students in order to foster an environment for both spiritual growth and academic success.

This type of learning environment also creates room for individuality and allows teachers to more effectively recognize and support their students' unique learning styles. The emphasis on reasoning and understanding content instead of simply memorizing equips students to become lifelong learners and live purposefully for the Kingdom of Christ in college and beyond.

Classical education comprises three learning stages known as the trivium: grammar, logic and rhetoric. Each stage builds to the next, corresponding with a different level of student development.

Grammar School

In grades 4 through 6, students develop their sense of wonder at the world God has made to establish a rich foundation for the rest of their education.

School of Logic

Grades 7 and 8 equip students with tools to become logical, sound thinkers.

School of Rhetoric

In grades 9 through 12, students combine their grammar and logic skills to become skilled, persuasive speakers.





The Great Conversation

One of our most popular courses, The Great Conversation series invites students into a centuries-long dialogue about universal experiences, historical events, and philosophical ideas. Starting with the works of Homer, Herodotus, Livy and Virgil, and spanning the history of Western civilization, students explore the great discourses of time through the lens of a biblical worldview. The ultimate goal is that, as students learn to love what is true, good and beautiful in these works, they will grow in their love of God and neighbor.

Fundamentals of Academic Writing


This course focuses on formal academic writing for high school students new to Wilson Hill composition or Wilson Hill students seeking more confidence and practice. Students practice the trajectory of the writing process from prewriting, drafting, revising, and editing to final submission by mastering the skills of the first three canons of rhetoric: invention, arrangement, and elocution. Not only do students gain greater proficiency in the art of writing well-crafted sentences, coherent paragraphs, and well-structured analytical and argumentative essays, they also learn to use proper MLA style.

Physics 1

This course integrates history, mathematics, and technical communication skills. Through successful completion of this course, a student will be able to develop a mastery of the basic tools of physics, including fundamental concepts and applications, computational skills, and analytical skills.

AP Statistics

This college level introductory course endeavors to give students a deeper understanding of how data is gathered, displayed, and analyzed so that they can begin to engage in a culture and society that relies on statistics for decision making. Students interact with current issues and perform statistical analyses using appropriate technological tools.

Meet a Mom of Five Who Chose Wilson Hill for Her Family

If you have reservations about online school, you're not the only one. Before becoming a Wilson Hill Academy parent, Shawna Barr homeschooled her son but, with four other children and a business to run, she was struggling to provide the education she wanted to give him. She hesitantly reserved a spot for her 7th grader in one of Wilson Hill Academy's online classrooms. It was a life-changing decision for her family.

Now, four of Barr's five children are students at Wilson Hill and thriving. While she expected the academics to be excellent, Barr was surprised by the close-knit community her students found in a virtual setting. She shares how Wilson Hill transformed her family's life:

"In the evenings when our family gathers all cozy on couches around the wood fire to debrief about our day, my husband always asks, 'So how was school today?' He asks about specific teachers and classes that we have all come to know. What music did Mrs. Pepin play today? Did she explain those problems that gave you trouble? How did Mrs. Bradley like your speech?

The Wilson Hill staff have found a way to transcend thousands of geographical miles and this new-fangled computer classroom to make students feel known, seen, valued, and connected. It is the most precious and unexpected gift.

What I observe in my kids is that being a student at Wilson Hill is kind of like being part of a secret society. They have these inside jokes, and they share a culture. It comes out clearly when they attend their house meetings, and often in what I hear them saying about the casual chatter between students and teachers. Going to class is actually like going somewhere. They feel known, included, and like they belong to something.

My kids have a 'real school' that they feel is their own. When I pushed that buy now button those many years ago, I was simply hoping to find someone to do a decently good job teaching my son the Great Books, a task that was beyond my ability at that time. What we received was certainly that, but so much more!"

Virtual school does not mean a lack of community. Sara Etter

Growing up in a family that volunteered regularly, Sarah Etter knew she wanted to spend her life serving the needy. Now a sophmore at Cedarville University, studying international studies and Spanish, she's aspiring to work in the nonprofit sector, hoping to work with men and women escaping human trafficking. Her education at Wilson Hill offered her a biblical framework to view the world and her future career.

"Growing up, I learned at home and at WHA that vocation was never about what job was going to make me the most money," Sara says. "It was always about following my calling, even if that meant having a lower salary. It was a theocentric view of vocation that focused on finding the skills God has given me and thinking about how to use them for His Kingdom."



Meet Our Founders

As parents in the early '90s, Bob and Nancy Donaldson were disappointed with the education options available to their children. It felt impossible to find a school that supported their family values, offered individualized teaching, and focused on critical thinking and reasoning instead of prioritizing memorization and testing. As they started learning about the classical Christian model, it seemed to be a perfect match. Once they saw their own two children flourish under this model, they committed to dedicating their careers to providing all families with biblically informed classical curriculum.

"One of the verses that really stimulated us when we were thinking about Christian education a couple of decades ago was the repeated theme in Judges that another generation arose in Israel that did not know the Lord nor the things He had done," Bob says. "To me, that's a failure of education, that's a failure of one generation to pass on the cultural truths and the truths about God to the next generation." This multigenerational mindset led the Donaldsons to found Wilson Hill in 2014, so that every family has the option to give their students a Christian education regardless of where they live. The Donaldsons' passion for classical Christian education stems from their deep desire to raise up the next generation of thoughtful, obedient, faithful servants of Christ.

They have had the opportunity to serve at a variety of Christian schools, including starting a brick-and-mortar classical Christian school that is nearing its 30th anniversary. Nancy has served at a number of schools in a variety of capacities, including principal, director of curriculum, teacher, consultant, and, currently, as president. Bob served on the board of Regents School of Austin, the national board of the Association of Classical Christian Schools for almost two decades, and currently serves as an elder at All Saints Presbyterian Church (PCA) in Austin. He teaches Foundations of US Government, War for American Independence and Advanced Composition 1 at Wilson Hill.
